

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS SURVEY



- If applicable, do you know your child(ren)'s school or daycare emergency policies?
Do you know how they will contact you in an emergency?

- If applicable, have you taught child(ren) how/when to call for help/911?

- Have you posted emergency numbers like BC Hydro, Public Works, and BC Poison Control in your home? Saved them in your phone?

- Do you have a fire extinguisher in your home? More than one? Is it expired?

- Does your home have a smoke detector installed? Is it functional?

- Does your home have a carbon monoxide detector installed? Is it functional?

- Do you test your smoke detector(s) monthly (press button)?

- Have you learned and practiced First Aid skills, such as CPR?

- Has your home had a FireSmart evaluation?

- Do you have a vehicle emergency kit in case of prolonged roadside delays?

- Have you ensured that your home address is clearly visible (and reflective) so First Responders can easily locate you?

- Do you know about the downtown Campbell River flood inundation zone?

- Have you assembled a Grab-n-Go Bag?

- Do you have a written and/or electronic Home Emergency Plan?

- Do you keep extra sets of vehicle keys, family medical information, insurance, and identification in a water- and fire-proof container?

- Have you established 2 household meeting locations (one near home in case of fire; one outside neighbourhood in case you cannot return home after disaster)?

- Have you established a household 'out of area/province contact' so your family can check in with them after disaster?

- Does your Home or Renter's Insurance policy include Displacement Insurance?

- Does your household practice fire, evacuation, and earthquake drills?

- How many litres of water have you stored in case of disaster? (5 litres per person per day is recommended for drinking, sanitation, and cooking.)

- Do you have a 'Shelter-in-Place' kit in an easy-to-access location?

- Are you signed up to receive emergency notifications?

If you aren't currently able to check many of these boxes, don't worry! *You are in the right place.*

This training is designed to increase your personal and community emergency preparedness. The first step is to understand how prepared you are right now (that's what we're doing here!). The second step is learning how to address the gaps you identify. Once you've taken those first steps, you're ready to take action!
