



BYLAW NO. 111

A BYLAW TO DESIGNATE PARKLAND ON CORTES ISLAND AND TO REGULATE USES AND ACTIVITIES WITHIN THAT PARK

WHEREAS the former Comox Strathcona Regional District has, by Bylaw No. 2096, converted the community parks function for Cortes Island to a local service;

AND WHEREAS a bylaw of the former Comox Strathcona Regional District that authorizes the operation of a service within all or part of the area comprising the Strathcona Regional District remains in force as an establishing bylaw of the Strathcona Regional District;

AND WHEREAS the service converted by Bylaw No. 2096 applies to portions of the Strathcona Regional District;

AND WHEREAS the Strathcona Regional District wishes to dedicate land within Electoral Area 'B' (Cortes Island) as community parkland and to regulate the uses of that land;

NOW THEREFORE the Board of Directors of the Strathcona Regional District, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

Park Designated

1. The real property located on Cortes Island and legally described as the Fractional Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Sayward District, is hereby designated as a community park.

Park Named

2. The community park herein designated shall be known by the name and style of Hank's Beach Forest Conservation Park.

Rules and Regulations

3. The rules and regulations applicable to Hank's Beach Forest Conservation Park shall be those set out in Schedule 'A' (Parks Regulations), attached to and forming part of this bylaw.

Authority Not Impaired

4. Nothing in this bylaw shall be interpreted as impairing or otherwise limiting the authority of the Regional District to develop, operate, manage or maintain the park designated herein.

Penalties

5. Any person who violates a provision of this bylaw is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties prescribed in the *Offence Act*.

Effective Date

6. This bylaw shall come into effect on July 1, 2011.

Citation





SCHEDULE 'A'
Park Regulations

Definitions

1. In this schedule the following definitions apply:

COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY means the sale or rental of goods or services.

CYCLE means any self-propelled wheeled vehicle including a bicycle, mountain bike and tricycle; but excluding a wheel chair.

NATURAL MATERIALS means vegetation of any kind, soil, gravel, rock, mineral, wood, driftwood, fallen timber, or any other material occurring naturally in the park, whether animate or inanimate.

PARKING or PARKED means to station any vehicle.

PARK TRAIL means any maintained path or trail designated for recreational use throughout the park.

PEDESTRIAN means a person travelling on foot, in a wheel chair, or an infant or young child in a stroller.

Park Use

2. Only non-motorized, non-commercial, recreation use is permitted in the park.

Damage

3. (1) No person shall remove, destroy, cut or damage any natural material from or in the park except authorized persons engaged in maintenance of the park.

(2) No person shall remove, destroy or damage any maps, signs, notices or rules posted in the park.

(3) No person shall introduce into the park any non-native plant materials.

Garbage

4. (1) No person shall deposit in the park any garbage, sewage refuse, empty or broken bottles, tin cans, cartons, paper or other waste or obnoxious material other than in a receptacle provided for that purpose.

(2) No person shall carry or transport into the park garbage, sewage, refuse or other waste of any kind.

Storage

5. No person shall use the park for storage of items such as unlicensed vehicles, boats, trailers, or any materials of any kind, except authorized persons storing maintenance materials for use in the park.

Fires

6. No person shall kindle, build, light, maintain or use any fire at any location in the park.

Firearms and hunting

7.
 - (1) No person shall discharge any firearm, bow or crossbow in the park at any time.
 - (2) No person shall hunt in the park.

Camping

8. No person shall use the park for the purpose of camping, tenting, or overnight accommodation.

Animals

9.
 - (1) No person shall ride, lead, or have charge of, any horse or other riding animal in the park except on equestrian trails as designated within the park.
 - (2) No grazing of domestic animals is permitted in the park.
 - (3) No person shall cause or permit any animal owned by him or in his control to be or remain at large in a park.
 - (4) Anyone entering a park with one or more dogs shall:
 - a) keep the dog(s) leashed at all times,
 - b) remove from the park the feces deposited by that dog(s), and
 - c) remove the dog(s) from the park when requested by anyone authorized to administer this bylaw.

Parking

10. No person shall park or station any vehicle in the park, other than in a designated parking area.

Vehicle Control

11.
 - (1) No person shall operate or cause to be operated a motorcycle, dirt bike or other motorized vehicle, other than a wheelchair, within the park except authorized personnel engaged in the development or maintenance of the park.
 - (2) No person shall ride any cycle in the park except on trails designated for such use.
